

# CAN YOU HELP US? COUNTRY SCHOOL PROJECT



The museum is grateful for the responses we've received to our request in the last newsletter for stories about attending country schools in northern Tama County! We are repeating that request again, as we know there are more of you who have good stories! We can interview you in person or we have a series of questions we'll send you to help trigger your memory. Please consider adding to our country school collection, which includes memories about attending Clark #3, Crystal #7, Baker's Grove (Perry Township #2). Here's one excerpt shared by Steve Podhajsky, who attended Crystal #7. "I would leave home and normally ride a bicycle a guarter mile of gravel 'til I came to the blind road where my neighbors the Boerm boys lived... I would get there as they were finishing up milking. Since I was so small sometimes they would carry me if I was having trouble keeping up. If the snow was too deep, Leonard, the oldest and biggest, would make a deal with me. He would put me on his shoulders if I would put my hands over his ears, since it was so cold. Once or twice a year the teacher, Mrs. Henry, would take a few of us to her house about four miles away to make cookies or some other craft while the rest stayed at the school with the older ones in charge".
